DRIVING HERE

TO HEAD TO NEPHI:

From Salt Lake City and Provo: Take I-15 South and US-6 West. Take exit 228.

From Capitol Reef and Canyonlands National Parks: Follow UT-24 West to US-50 West in Sevier County. Then take US-50 West and I-15 N to UT-28 North, take exit 222.

From southwest Utah (St. George, Cedar City, or spots around Zion National Park and Dixie National Forest): Take I-15 North all the way up to exit 222. Then merge onto UT-28 North.

From eastern Nevada (Ely, Lund, and Baker): Drive onto US-50 East/ Great Basin Blvd, then make a left onto US-6 East, a right onto UT-132, and another left onto UT-28 North.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

MAKE YOUR TRIP TO JUAB A SAFE, MEMORABLE ONE.

Map and plan the old fashioned way.

Venturing through Juab is like stepping into an off-the-grid oasis. While disconnecting is a fun respite for most visitors, it can be tricky to get around. Prepare for limited cell service throughout the county, even in popular spots like the Nebo Loop and the town of Eureka.

Print out a topographic map to best navigate Juab Valley's dirt roads and trails. Or download an offline version of Google Maps before setting out.

Emergency services are limited.

Emergency services here can be both costly and time-consuming. Access points for trails and roads can be difficult to reach, especially in snowy or wet weather.

Check conditions before heading out, follow all trail guidance, and exercise caution when scaling rocky or uneven terrain.

Fuel should top your packing list.

Whether you prefer traveling light or tend to pack lots of suitcases, extra food, water, and fuel is vital regardless of the season. Juab Valley is undeveloped and uninhabited in several spots so don't depend on seeing fast-food restaurants, gas stations, or even water sources near outdoor recreation.

M Year-round, layer up.

Like much of Utah, Juab County has a dry, semi-arid, desert climate with temperatures that can swing throughout the day. Expect night-time temperatures to dip – sometimes up to 20-30 degrees. Pack layers for your expeditions, along with additional ones to bundle up in the evenings.

Four-wheel drive = your friend.

While it won't make you invincible, four-wheel drive is best for navigating Juab's snowy and icy conditions. If not, snow tires might be required in some parts, and you'll need them to stay on the road.

Follow trail signage – and your instincts.

Juab's landscape can be powerful, wild, and has unique hazards. Stick to marked, groomed trails. Take care around high, steep cliffs around the Nebo Loop. Scaling any snowy terrain carries an avalanche risk.

Honor your limits.

Your trip to Juab should be fun, not a record-breaking feat. Study the difficulty of hiking trails (page 24) and recognize your physical limits. Turn back right away if you begin to feel tired or are running low on water or fuel.

Burning pallets leaves behind nails, harming more than just vour feet or tires. It also creates

environmental hazards that affect everyone and everything in Juab County, including our landscape.

Nails in pallets are, well, as tough as nails. Unlike your typical campfire or bonfire reaching temperatures north of 600°F. steel nails don't melt until 2600°E.

It's not just about the piles of nails, though. Pallets are often constructed or painted with toxic chemicals, including preservatives, pesticides, and fungicides. When ignited, these chemicals release fumes that can cause breathing problems for people and wildlife and carry ashes that leach into the ground.

Even using untreated pallets poses significant risks. Pallet wood is brittle and fast-burning, resulting in

a more intense, unpredictable burn and making fires harder to contain.

Protect Juab County and opt for fires that leave no trace behind.



WHAT CAN I DO WITH OLD PALLETS, THEN?

Instead of burning pallets in Juab:

- · Donate them to a local business or nonprofit for reuse.
- Repurpose them for your next DIY project.
- Remember that untreated pallets can be recycled.

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VISITING RESPONSIBLY

WHEN YOU COME TO JUAB, YOU'RE ENTERING A REGION WITH LOCAL RESIDENTS, NATURAL RESOURCES, AND VISITORS FROM ALL OVER. FOLLOW THESE LEAVE NO TRACE PRINCIPLES:

1. Do a Little Extra Planning

Research your destinations, pack for a range of conditions, and make backup plans (just in case) before you go. Check out our Juabspecific tips on page 10.

2. Stick to Trails and "Overnight Right"

Follow signage and stick to the path on all trails and campsites, whether you're taking a solo hike or a group ride.

3. Trash Your Trash

Pack out everything you pack in, including garbage. If trash cans are full or not available, be prepared to bring home any waste.

4. Protect Indigenous Cultural Heritage

While enjoying Yuba State Park and other parts of Juab County, you may come across stone tools, broken pottery, rock art, and traces of Native American culture. If you discover archaeological or historical artifacts on your travels, please leave them alone and notify State Park or BLM officials.

5. Minimize Campfire Impacts

Keep your fires small and contained within existing fire rings. Check out **UtahFireInfo.gov** for local restrictions. See Do It Right, Don't Ignite for more guidance.

6. Keep Wildlife Wild

Respect the home of Juab's diverse creatures and wildlife by only observing from a distance. Never follow or feed wildlife and ensure pets are within your control.

7. Share Our Parks, Trails, and Roads

Be mindful of your and your group's noise levels, including your vehicles. Everyone enjoys the outdoors in different ways: some may go outside to be with friends and family and others may be looking for solitude.

PLAY

WHERE NATURE REIGNS SUPREME

Make wide open spaces your playground. Whether you prefer mountains or deserts, canyons or creeks, trails or roads, or all the above, get ready to immerse yourself in the rugged beauty and boundless possibilities of Juab outdoors.

OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLES (OHV)

Bring the ATVs, buggies, and 4x4s. Much of Juab's land is public and under the control of the Bureau of Land Management and Forest Service, making it open for recreational use.

Little Sahara Recreation Area

With over 60,000 acres of sand dunes and sagebrush flats, Little Sahara is Juab's premier off-road destination. Purchase tickets online.

Mount Nebo National Scenic Byway

Street-legal OHVs can drive through the southern end of the Wasatch Mountains to catch some of Utah's most majestic sites, including its tallest peak, Mount Nebo (11,928 feet).



16 Cherry Creek

A splash-friendly spot that's home to popular desert dirt bike and motorcycle races.

Levan Canyon

Travel through this scenic, fun drive on a maintained road. No four-wheel drive is required during dry weather, but keep an eye out for spurs.

Mona Pole Canyon

The only route off the Nebo Loop open to ATVs. Access this out-and-back route from the Nebo Loop or from the Mona side. This route can be very rough and is advised only for experienced riders. Continue your off-roading: Juab.ls/Play/OHV

Mount Nebo National Scenic Byway (Nebo Loop)

Wind your way and experience the spectacular wonders of the Wasatch Mountains. Lots of overlooks dot your journey, inviting you to pull over, savor the vistas, and snap some unforgettable shots.

Highway 6 Scenic Drive (The Grand Army of the Republic Highway)

Journey along this photoworthy, hour-long loop off of I-15, passing through the historic town of Eureka. View remnants of buildings that tell stories of the American West and visit the Tintic Motorcycle Works Museum (page 44) and Eureka Mining District (page 45).

SLUMBER UNDER THE STARS.

Yuba State Park Campgrounds

Oasis Campground is fully developed. Travelers looking for a primitive, immersive experience can access campgrounds at Painted Rocks and along the North and West Beaches. Eagle View is a drive-in dirt road and four-wheel drive is recommended. The Oasis Vista area also offers primitive day use and primitive group camping. Here, you can also enjoy fishing (page 22), ziplines (page 29), and water recreation opportunities (page 20).

Note: All park entrance fees apply even if the entrance station is not staffed. Please use the self-pay envelope system, or simply scan the QR code sign upon arrival to pay for day use or camping in the Oasis and North Beaches campgrounds if sites are available.

BOAT, PADDLE, OR FLOAT AT THE YUBA AND MONA RESERVOIRS. WITH SUMMER WATER TEMPERATURES FALLING BETWEEN 70-75 DEGREES, WATERSPORT ENTHUSIASTS OF ALL KINDS WILL FIND A HAVEN.

Yuba State Park

Enjoy a day at the lake! This land is home to two boat ramps for all types of watercraft. Equipment rentals and scuba diving and lessons are also available at the park.

Mona Reservoir

Located in the north end of Juab Valley, this reservoir is a serene spot for boating, jet skiing, or just unwinding. This reservoir has recently experienced significant water loss, so check its current status before planning your visit.

Baker Hot Springs

Unwind at one of Utah's best-kept secrets. Lounge in three natural hot springs pools situated on an isolated piece of BLM land while taking in the desert views.

FISH

JUAB ISNT JUST DESERT. IT'S HOME TO SEVERAL PRIME FISHING HOLES.

Burraston Ponds

Once the campsite of Indian chiefs, these waters near Mona are annually stocked with rainbow trout and have been known to hold tiger and brown trout. Cast your line on a canoe or along the bank.

Yuba State Park

Along the sandy shorelines, find good action for walleye, perch, and trout. Experienced anglers might opt to scout out northern pike, some of which reach trophy size. For the best experience, troll or jig from a boat.

Jenkins Flat

Nestled along the Mount Nebo National Scenic Byway, this spot offers family-friendly fishing adventures. Come winter, opportunities for ice fishing abound.

Salt Creek

Catch quality trout in this canyon located east of Nephi along Highway 132.

Mount Nebo National Scenic Byway

The Nebo Loop stretches for 38 miles of winding, paved roads, providing an exciting challenge. Bike trails reach elevations of over 9,000 feet. The Byway is open May 1 through November 1; weather conditions may affect these dates.

Pony Express National Historic Trail

Step into the stirrups of the country's first mail carriers. The best time to access this off-road cycling trail is late April to mid-October. Learn more about this trail on page 40.

HIKE

ROAM THROUGH AND RECHARGE IN NATURE. JUAB OFFERS HIKING OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL AGES AND ABILITIES.

Mount Nebo National Scenic Byway

Pick your path from 38 miles accessible through the Wasatch Mountains' southern end. Pair your exploration with a free audio tour hosted by TravelStorys. The Byway is open from May 1 through November 1; weather conditions may affect these dates.

Paul Bunyan's Woodpile

→ BLM.gov/Visit/ Paul-Bunyons-Woodpile

This massive, neat stack of lava logs might give the impression of

being cut by America's legendary lumberjack! In reality, these geological wonders were formed approximately 30 million years ago when the lava flow from a volcano solidified into large columns. Over time, erosion uncovered these formations, revealing columns that measure up to 15 feet long today.

Find the Woodpile just east of Highway 6 near Jericho Junction (the access road to Little Sahara Recreation Area). From Eureka, drive south on Highway 6 for about 15 miles until you come to a good dirt road heading east into the foothills. From Jericho Junction, drive north for about 3 miles to find the dirt road.

Follow the dirt road east for about 3.5 miles to the trailhead. There are signs along the dirt road showing the way and marking the trailhead.

Mt. Nebo

At 11,928 feet, Mt. Nebo is the highest peak on the Wasatch Front. Ascend to the summit on a rugged day hike or backpacking adventure. Most hikers attack the summit on a 14-mile round trip trail beginning on the Nebo Bench Trailhead at the Monument.

Salt Creek Trail

Featuring an accessible waterfall and stunning views, this easy route takes about an hour to complete. Turn left when the creek crosses the trail to see the waterfall. Located in Bear Canyon Campground (page 19).

West Desert

Wind your way through the mountain, discovering hidden juniper and pine forests and diverse wildlife. These trails offer remarkable views of the Great Basin and surrounding desert.

Ibapah Peak

Embark on a challenging, isolated, out-and-back hike in the West Desert, ascending to an elevation surpassing over 12,000 feet. This trail covers a distance of 14.4 miles round trip and typically takes about 10 hours to complete. The breathtaking vistas are well worth it!

Bear Canyon Trail

Explore the Mount Nebo Wilderness on this moderately difficult out-and-back hike that takes an average of 3.5 hours to complete. Located in Bear Canyon Campground (page 19).

SNOWMOBILE

Mount Nebo National Scenic Byway

Snow transforms the Nebo Loop into a winter wonderland. From December through March, portions of the trail are groomed with elevations reaching 9,200 feet. Snowmobiling routes start at the Salt Creek Canyon trailheads and offer access to the Mt. Nebo high-tops and wilderness area, along with the Wasatch Range.

following this easy trail through a narrow forested canyon.

Chicken Creek Canyon

Find great views with cool mountain ledges and lush aspen and pine trees. This trail begins in a little town called Levan and follows a gravel road.

VENTURE TO JUAB COUNTY'S HILLS AND DESERTS FOR A VARIETY OF UNIQUE ROCKS AND MINERALS. CASUAL AND SERIOUS COLLECTORS ALIKE ARE USUALLY REWARDED FOR THEIR EFFORTS.

Topaz Mountain

→ BLM.gov/Visit/Topaz-Mountain

Search the southern washes and slopes of this mountain to uncover its namesake: semiprecious gemstones that glimmer as hard, transparent crystals. You can also find many other gems and minerals, including the highly sought-after red beryl.

To get there from Nephi, travel southwest on Highway 132 for about 34 miles to the town of Lynndyl and the junction with Highway 6. Continue south on U.S. Highway 6 for about 5 miles and then turn west onto the signed

Brush Wellman Road. Drive northwest on the paved Brush Wellman Road for about 37 miles, to the signed dirt road leading up to Topaz Mountain.

Dugway Geode Beds

→ Simpson Springs Callao Road, West Juab

Dig for crystal-filled geodes, which often reveal a fluorescent green hue under UV light. You also might encounter the orange and cream-colored Mt. Nebo Calcite, which can be used to create decorative items.

Begin by familiarizing yourself with the area you'd like to visit with surface-management status maps or site-specific land-ownership maps. These maps are accessible online and are also sold by the Utah Geological Survey and the Bureau of Land Management.

Rockhounding permits may be required to collect on some lands in Juab.

Before your dig, read up on Utah's full list of rock, mineral, and collecting rules at Geology. Utah. Gov.

32 Joy, Utah

The timeless desert landscape in and around the ghost town of Joy, provides stargazers with an experience like no other. With a bit of imagination and playful fantasy,

Devil's Kitchen

Devil's Kitchen, also known as Little Bryce Canyon, is located on the southern end of the Mount Nebo National Scenic Byway. Hike up and view constellations between the rock formations.



TAKING ON THE STARS: STARGAZING TIPS

Plan your gaze.

Skies will be clearest during a new moon or within three days before and three days after. Look at weather to make sure there isn't cloud cover or storms headed your way.

Be prepared to stay up.

Skies darken starting 60 to 90 minutes after sundown. During the summer months, that's around 10 p.m. The longer you stay up, the darker and more dense the skies will become.

It might be chilly.

Check local temperatures after sunset. Bring warmer clothing.

You can just bring yourself.

Many stargazing sites in Juab County are viewable to the naked eye. To enhance your experience, bring along a pair of binoculars or a small telescope.

Kids make great astrotourists.

Stargazing is a super family activity! Encourage kids to find constellations or a planet, or to make up a story about what they see. They might get sleepier sooner than adults so make them comfortable and bring snacks.

Expand your knowledge.

Lots of cell phone apps can help you identify constellations and stars. You can also find more resources at VisitUtah.com/Things-To-Do/Stargazing.

Spanning nearly 18,000 acres with 10,000 acres of marshes, Fish Springs provide vital habitat for migrating wetland birds to stop and replenish energy stores. Visitors can take self-guided tours on an 11-mile autoroute or picnic under the Thomas Ranch Watchable Wildlife Viewing Area.


Spring: Watch the daily flow of avian visitors, many of which are in bright breeding plumage. Geese and ducks begin to arrive in early March. Shore migration lasts from April to mid-May.

Summer: While some birds continue further north to breed, many stay to raise their young. Canada Goose goslings and some shorebird chicks make their debut. In June and July, peep ducklings, along with American Avocets and Black-necked Stilts, appear. Scan overhead to see owls, eagles, and other birds resting in the trees or soaring over the wetlands' skies.




Fall: Shorebirds, waterfowl, and songbirds venture back through the refuge as a pit stop on their way south. Tundra Swans begin to arrive mid-October and stay until January.

Winter: From December to March, northern harriers, rough-legged hawks, and short-eared owls prowl the marsh, searching the frozen ground for prey. During the day, Bald Eagles feed and rest in the refuge.
